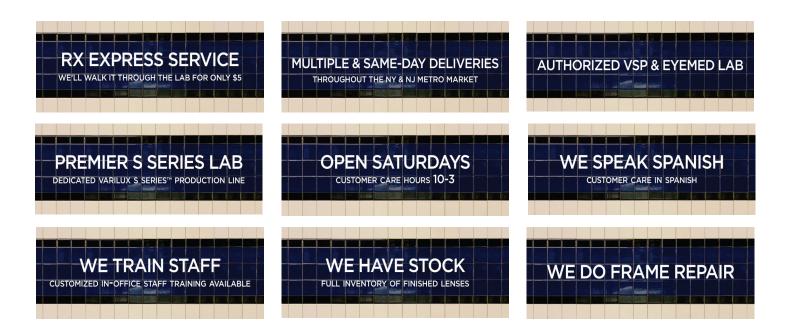

Legislative Report and Other Important News in Our Industry

- The Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General recently published a detailed report calling for additional oversight of remote patient monitoring (RPM) in Medicare. Findings included increase of RPM adoption, flexibility in RPM service delivery, Medicare RPM oversight challenges. This puts the RPM industry as a whole supports efforts to identify and eliminate fraudulent operations as they undermine the credibility and effectiveness and better genuine RPM services.
- It is now official that the New York State practical exam in ophthalmic dispensing has become virtual. It will be given at different test sites in New York State at dates to be mentioned on website http://www.op.nysed.gov. Look for the Profession of Ophthalmic Dispensing exams.

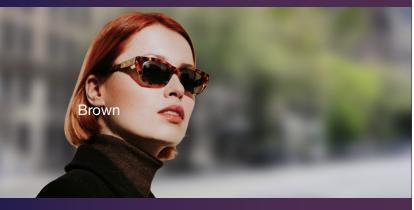
